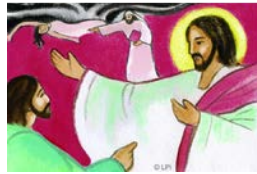

### ***From the Desk of Msgr. John***

Pope Francis has blessed us with his Papal Visit this past week. During his visit he canonized a new saint, Saint Junipero Serra.

Miguel Joseph Serra was born November 24, 1713, on the island of Mallorca. He entered the Franciscan Order in 1730 and was ordained a priest in 1737, taking the name Fray Junipero Serra. In 1737 he received permission to become an Apostolic Missionary and traveled to the New World. He arrived in Vera Cruz after a 90 day journey, then walked 250 miles to attend The Apostolic College of San Fernando in Mexico City where he received intensive preparation for missionary service.

Fray Juniper Serra began his lifelong service to the California Indians by spending nine years traveling over 5,000 miles in New Spain as an itinerant preacher. He then went on to take over the fourteen missions that had been previously founded by the Jesuits and established nine more. The chain of missions stretched from six hundred miles south of San Diego to San Francisco. During this time, with permission from Rome, he administered the Sacrament of Confirmation to over five thousand converts. While enduring much physical suffering and many hardships, Father Serra spent the rest of his life traveling and administering to the missions he had founded. After 53 years of service, he passed away on August 28, 1784, and was buried at his beloved Mission San Carlos Borromeo on the Carmel River.

Pope John Paul II officially declared Junipero Serra "Blessed" on December 11, 1987. Last Wednesday, September 23, 2015, Pope Francis canonized him while visiting the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington D.C.

### **26th Sunday in Ordinary Time**

"It is better for you to enter into life crippled than with two feet to be thrown into Gehenna." Jesus' listeners would have recognized this reference. Gehenna was in fact a deep ravine located outside of Jerusalem that had a sordid past. It had been the site of pagan rituals in which children were forced to walk through fire. Thus the spot had become known as a symbol for the fires of hell.

In today's Gospel, Jesus is making a dramatic contrast between "life" (heaven) and Gehenna (hell). He emphasizes that no sacrifice is too great to keep oneself out of the miseries of hell. His images are shocking. Cutting off hands and feet? Plucking out eyes? Ouch! Is hell really so bad that we'd rather go to heaven maimed than go to hell in one piece? Apparently so.



Some interpreters suggest that Jesus was using hyperbole to make his point. Perhaps. But whether it was literal or figurative, the point remains clear: we need to do whatever it takes to avoid sin and ultimately to avoid hell. The catechism defines this state of eternal misery as "definitive self-exclusion from communion with God." Yes, self-exclusion. God doesn't "send" anyone to hell. Rather, someone chooses hell when he or she freely chooses something over God and won't repent.

The choice is ours: cut out the source of the sin--painful though it may be--or stubbornly march with our beloved sins straight into Gehenna. Realistically, what we choose "over" God are not so much our physical body parts as things like a high-paying job that isn't ethical, a favorite pastime that isn't morally upright, or a relationship that isn't chaste. Jesus tells us clearly today, whatever it is that "causes you to sin, cut it off." Period.
